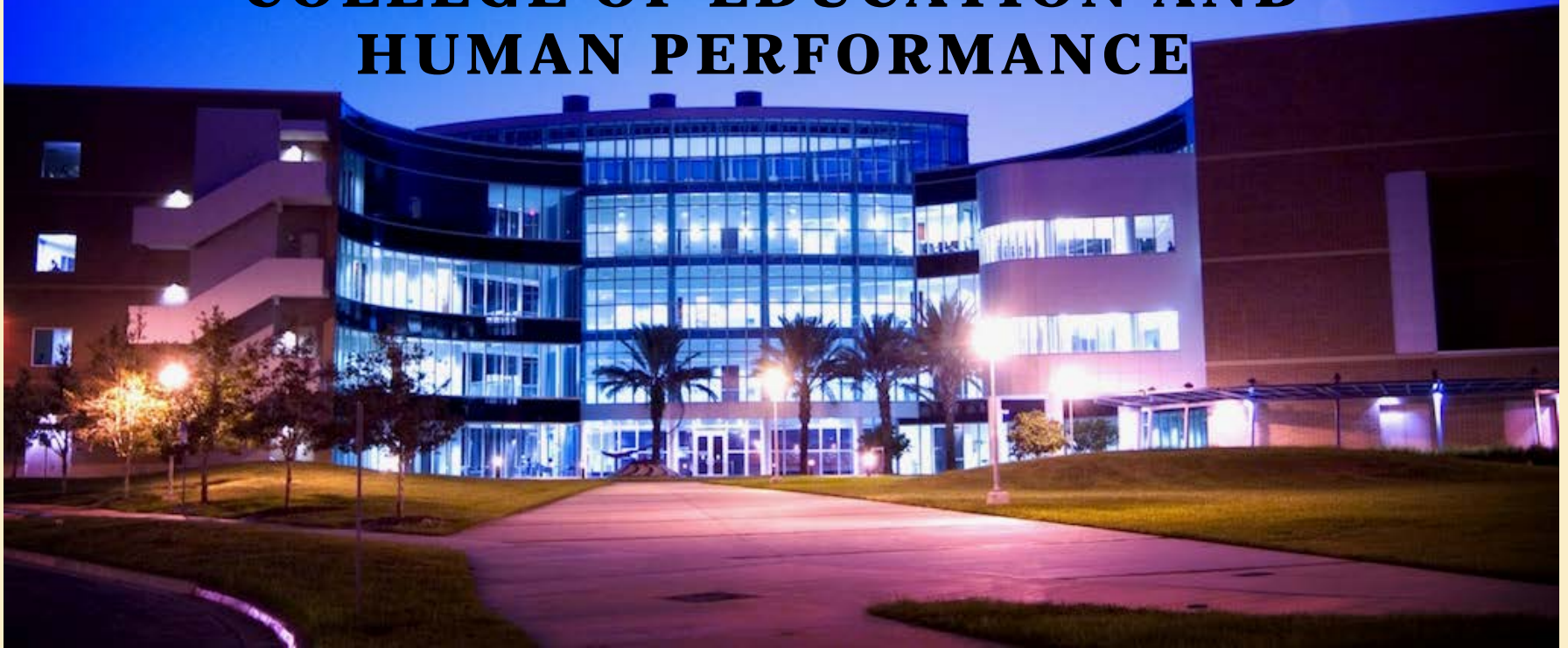

 - Students required to complete all 3 courses prior to admission.

 - **Under Core Basic Level - removed the options of MAE 2801 Elementary School Mathematics or MAC 1105 College Algebra and replaced with MAE 3310 Elementary Mathematics for Teaching I**
 - **MAE 2801 will sub for MAE 3310 if student took it Fall 2017 or prior at the community/ state college. We will not advise students in 2017 catalog year to take MAE 2801.**

- DEP 2004 Developmental Psychology is no longer a Common Program Pre-requisite.
- Replaced with choice of EDF 2130 Child and Adolescent Development for Educators or SOW 3104 Human Behavior and the Social Environment I

- . Electives changed from 7 semester hours to 6 semester hours**

Elementary Education B.S



- **EDE 4943 Internship II is now 9sh**
- **Internship II is taken with EDE 4301 Senior Seminar in Elementary Education**
 - *Will strengthen and enhance the interns experience by providing feedback and support to students as they navigate the internship process.*
- **MAE 3310 Elementary Mathematics for Teaching I will be taken Semester I - Junior Year**
- **MAE 3311 Elementary Mathematics for Teaching II will be taken Semester II - Junior Year**

Transfer students:

- MAE 2801 will sub for MAE 3310 if student took it Fall 2017 or prior at the community/ state college. We will not advise students in 2017 catalog year to take MAE 2801.**

- The Department is still looking at course syllabi for acceptable subs for EDE 2280 and EDF 2720**

- Students who took PET 2081 can use towards the 6sh of electives. It does not sub for EDE 2280.**

Elementary Education LLL Track

- MAE 2801 removed from core basic level and EDE 2280 added
- EDE 4223 Integrated Arts and Movement in the Elementary School removed from Semester III
- EDG 2949 Experiential Learning increased from 2sh to 3sh
- MAE 3310 added to Semester III
- MAE 3311 added as an option to LLL Specialization requirements

Sport and Exercise Science B.S



- - PET 4926 Practicum was moved to Preferred electives
- Additional Coaching courses were added to electives
- Restricted electives increased from 25sh to 34sh
- 18 hours must be chosen from a preferred electives list
- PET 4312C Kinesiology/Biomechanics name changed to Applied Biomechanics

Restricted Access



- Complete all General Education requirements
- Foreign Language requirements
- Complete all Education Program Prerequisites
- Passing scores on all four parts of the General Knowledge Test*
- Minimum 2.5 overall GPA or higher (2.75 for Early Childhood)
- Gordon Rule

- *Exceptional Student Education requires an interview with faculty advisor prior to admission



*Non-certification programs do not require the GKT



Advice for Education Majors



- **Take Education Program Pre-Requisites***
 - EDF 2005: Introduction to the Teaching Profession
 - EDF 2085: Introduction to Diversity for Educators
 - EME 2040: Introduction to Technology for Educators
- **Take and pass all 4 parts of the General Knowledge Test**
- **Apply to UCF early (up to one year prior to desired term)**
- **RSVP for early orientation**

Steps to Move from Pending to an Education and Human Performance Major

Pending is a classification used to identify those students who need to work on meeting College of Education and Human Performance admission criteria. All admission requirements must be met before declaring a major in the College of Education and Human Performance and registering for required 3000/4000 level restricted courses.

The following information is provided to meet the College of Education and Human Performance Admission Requirements:

- a. **UCF General Education Program (GEP)**
 - Meet with an academic advisor at least once each semester for assistance with selecting courses that will count towards your major.
- b. **Foreign Language Requirement**
 - Complete the State University System Foreign Language Admission requirement: 2 years of the same foreign language in high school or one year of college instruction in the same foreign language (American Sign Language is accepted).
- c. **Education Program Prerequisites**
 - Along with the UCF General Education Program requirements, students must complete additional courses required by the College of Education and Human Performance.
- d. **GPA 2.5 or above**
 - An advisor will go over your GPA and determine what types of grades are necessary to bring your GPA to the 2.5 minimum (*2.75 overall minimum GPA required for Early Childhood Development and Education (ECDE)*).
- e. **General Knowledge Test (GKT)**
 - Students must pass all four parts of the GKT prior to being admitted to the College of Education and Human Performance. The GKT will satisfy both the admission and graduation requirement for teacher certification programs. Register for the GKT at the FTCE website: <http://www.fl.nesinc.com/>.
The following Non-certification programs are NOT required to complete the GKT: Sport and Exercise Science, Technical Education and Industry Training, ECDE- Development Track and, All Lifelong Learning Tracks.
- f. **Gordon Rule Requirement**
 - To meet the University Gordon Rule Requirement you must complete four courses of writing and two courses of mathematics at the level of college algebra or higher with a minimum grade of C-.

- g. **Change of Major Form**
 - Upon completing all requirements for admission to the College of Education and Human Performance, please complete an online Change of Major Form to move from Pending to your desired major via the myUCF portal (my.ucf.edu). Regional campus students will complete a hard-copy Change of Major form with their Academic Advisor.

A GUIDE FOR

- 1. What is the Florida Teacher Certification Exam (FTCE)?**
 - The FTCE consists of three tests: the General Knowledge Test, the Professional Education Test, and the Subject Area Exam.
 - Passing scores on all sections of the FTCE are required prior to Internship II for teacher preparation programs. Visit the FTCE Prep Website for information
 - *The General Knowledge Test is both an admission and graduation requirement for the College of Education and Human Performance.*
 - **Non-Certification programs in the College of Education and Human Performance are NOT required to complete the FTCE.**

- 2. What is the General Knowledge Test (GKT)?**
 - The General Knowledge Test is a basic skills test consisting of the following four subtests: Math, English, Reading, and Essay.
 - It is highly recommended that you take this test after successfully completing your general education English Composition and Mathematics classes.
 - Passing scores on all four parts of the GKT are required for admission to the College of Education and Human Performance and to apply for Internship I.

- 3. What is the Professional Education Test (PEd)?**
 - The Professional Education Test consists of multiple choice questions which address pedagogy and professional practices.
 - A passing score on the Professional Education Test is strongly recommended as soon as possible after completing the following courses: EDG4410, EDF4467 and TSL4080 **AND** required prior to entry into Internship II. *Early Childhood Development & Education – Education Track (PK-3) should take this test upon completion of their junior year, during their second semester.*

- 4. What is the Subject Area Exam (SAE)?**
 - The Subject Area Exam is an evaluating tool designed to test you on the content knowledge of your specific major.
 - It is highly recommended that you take this test after you have completed your specialization courses or prior to Internship II, whichever comes first. A passing score on the appropriate Subject Area exam is required prior to entry in to Internship II.

5. How do I register for these tests?

- The method of testing is computer-based. To register for computer-based testing, you may visit the FTCE website at www.fl.nesinc.com.

6. How much do the tests cost?

- Regular Administration of the General Knowledge Test is \$130.00, Professional Education Test is \$150.00 and the Subject Area Examination is \$200.00. If you took and did not pass a test and want to retake it, you must pay the retake fee.

7. How much time am I given to complete each test?

- The General Knowledge Test testing time is approximately five hours. Essay- 50 minutes, English Language Skills- 40 minutes, Reading- 55 minutes, and Mathematics- 100 minutes.
- The Professional Education Test testing time is approximately two and a half hours.
- The Subject Area Exam testing time can range from approximately two and a half hours to five hours.

8. Where are the tests administered?

- The test administration locations can be found on the FTCE website at www.fl.nesinc.com.

9. When will I receive my official test scores?

- You will be able to access your score report as a PDF document via your secure account on the FTCE website (www.fl.nesinc.com) approximately 5-7 weeks after the test date. It is recommended that you print out your score report for your records. Unofficial scores are not accepted and cannot be used to satisfy your admission and /or graduation requirement(s) for the UCF College of Education and Human Performance.

10. Where do I send my official score report?

- Request your official score report be sent electronically to UCF. Otherwise, a copy of the official score report must be submitted to the Office of Undergraduate Affairs, ED 110, fax (407) 823-3852.

*Verify passing scores on all sections of the FTCE are reflected on your degree audit.
Review your degree audit often by logging on to the myUCF portal at www.my.ucf.edu*

Transfer Tips

- Apply to UCF early
- RSVP for an early orientation

Associate of Arts (A.A.) Degree

- A.A. degree earned at a Florida public institution **OR**
- Complete the UCF General Education Program Requirement

Transcripts (Official Copies)

- Submit all college and/or university transcripts to the Undergraduate Admissions office
- Submit high school transcripts to the Undergraduate Admissions office

Foreign Language Requirement

- Completed 2 years of the same foreign language in high school **OR**
- Complete 1 year of college instruction in the same foreign language

Documentation in your possession the day of Transfer Orientation

- Transcripts (official or unofficial)
- Proof of GPA
- Official copies of General Knowledge Test (GKT) scores (Non-certification programs are NOT required to complete GKT)

College of Education and Human Performance Admission Requirements

- Complete the University General Education requirements or its equivalent (i.e. an A.A. degree from an approved Florida community college or state university)
- Complete the Education Program Prerequisites
- Have a minimum 2.5 overall GPA. Minimum 2.75 overall GPA required for Early Childhood Development & Education
- Pass all four parts of the General Knowledge Test (Non-certification programs are NOT required to complete GKT)
- Complete State University System Foreign Language Admission requirement: 2 years in high school or 1 year in college of the same foreign language or American Sign Language
- Complete the Gordon Rule Requirement.

Once admission requirements have been met, submit a College of Education and Human Performance Change of Major form.
